Leaf Blower Ban Expanded

The Township Committee passed an ordinance expanding the prohibited time that gas powered

leaf blowers cannot be used. It is now May 1st rather than May 15th. It remains through September 30th. Additionally, the new ordinance applies to residents as well as lawn maintenance businesses. The use of gas-powered leaf blowers are not permitted on Sundays by residents and businesses.

- Gas powered leaf blowers are prohibited from May 1st through September 30th.
- From October 1st through April 30th, gas powered leaf blowers are only permitted on Monday through Friday from 8am to 6pm and on Saturday from 10am to 5pm.



- Gas leaf blowers are not permitted on Sunday.
- No one is permitted to place leaves in the street more than
 7 days before the scheduled pick-up by Public Works.

Township Committee to Approve Library Bond

On February 16th the Township Committee will hold a hearing and take a final vote on a \$12 million bond for the new library building. The nearly \$20 million project will be funded by an \$8.4 million grant from the State of New Jersey, \$1 million from the Maplewood Library Foundation, additional fund raising from the public, and \$10.2 million from the Township. The bond is for \$12 million to make certain there are sufficient moneys for the project due to the timing of the state grant and private fundraising efforts. The debt will be reduced upon receipt of the state and foundation grants.

Architects and engineers are now working with Maplewood Library staff and board members to come up with the final design of the new building. In the fall, the library building is expected to relocate to the Hilton Branch and other public space. Construction on the new building will begin in early 2022 and will be finished by the fall of 2023.

The past year has been frustrating. I want to tell people in the grocery store to back up six feet and the person walking past me down the street to pull their mask up over their nose. It's continual reminders to my family to wash their hands as soon as they come in the house. It's keeping my coworkers vigilant and reminding them that we cannot get lax around each other.

I have read articles and heard news stories that imply that nurses made this career choice and risking our lives are part of the job. The rationing of personal protective equipment, the disregard for science and safety has many nurses wondering if we are essential or dispensable? I've had colleagues and friends die from this virus. I know some nurses who are so scared and burned out at this point, that they have chosen to retire.

I'll admit that being recently revered as a hero doesn't dismiss being human and having the same fears as the people who rely on you. The best way to say thank you to nurses, doctors, frontline and essential workers is to remain diligent, consistent in our efforts to stay healthy and each do our part in stopping the spread of this terrible virus
